

# *S1 Civic Addressing Bylaw*

## *To Save a Life, Every Second Counts*

**- Post Your Civic Number!**



### *Why?*

To help emergency vehicles find homes as quickly as possible, the S1 Civic Addressing Bylaw provides standards **to ensure civic numbers are posted in a location that can be easily seen by drivers - day or night.**

### *Standards for Posting Civic Numbers?*

The Bylaw reflects what the majority of citizens have been doing:

- ✓ posting civic numbers at the front of the property (on the same side of the road)
- ✓ using a double-sided number so it can be seen from both directions; and
- ✓ using white numbers on a blue reflective background.
- ✓ posting civic numbers horizontally.



### *But What if:*

- Your civic number is posted, but it isn't white numbers on a blue reflective background - *the existing number can remain as long as another civic number is posted following the standards.*
- You posted the civic number on your mailbox –*you can use small numbers on the mailbox, but post the white number on blue reflective background at the front on the property.*
- You posted the civic number on the opposite side of the road – *change the location to in front on your property (on the same side of the road).*
- You haven't posted the civic number - *post it as soon as possible.*
- You don't know where to purchase a civic number – *contact one of the County offices\* or refer to the list of civic number providers.*
